

SITUATION REPORT – *HYMENOSCYPHUS FRAXINEUS*

At 12:00 noon 2nd November 2022

The following table records the numbers of 10km x 10km grid squares in the wider environment¹ confirmed with one or more cases of *Hymenoscyphus fraxineus* infection (Chalara ash dieback) on ash trees². It is broken down by country and the year in which they were discovered.
