The dataset is owned by and maintained by the FC Plant Health team. Data held includes area and location. The SPHN dataset is a live system, with data extracted at a specific point in time.

Statutory Plant Health Notices

How the data is collected:	Data are collected from Statutory Plant Health Notices issued by the Plant Health Teams in the Forestry Commission, Natural Resources Wales and Forest Service.
Original purpose of dataset and any other publications from the data:	The data are used by Plant Health staff throughout the year, to assist in administering SPHNs and to monitor the spread of pests and diseases that require compulsory felling of trees.
Security of the data – how it is managed:	Access to the database is restricted to relevant Plant Health staff.
Is supporting metadata available for this dataset?:	Plant Health staff maintain supporting metadata.
How do we get access?:	Aggregate data was requested from the Plant Health team. Data are provided by e-mail.
Quality assurance:	A draft of the statistics to be produced is provided to colleagues in Plant Health, seeking feedback on the figures to be presented and the accompanying commentary and background text.
