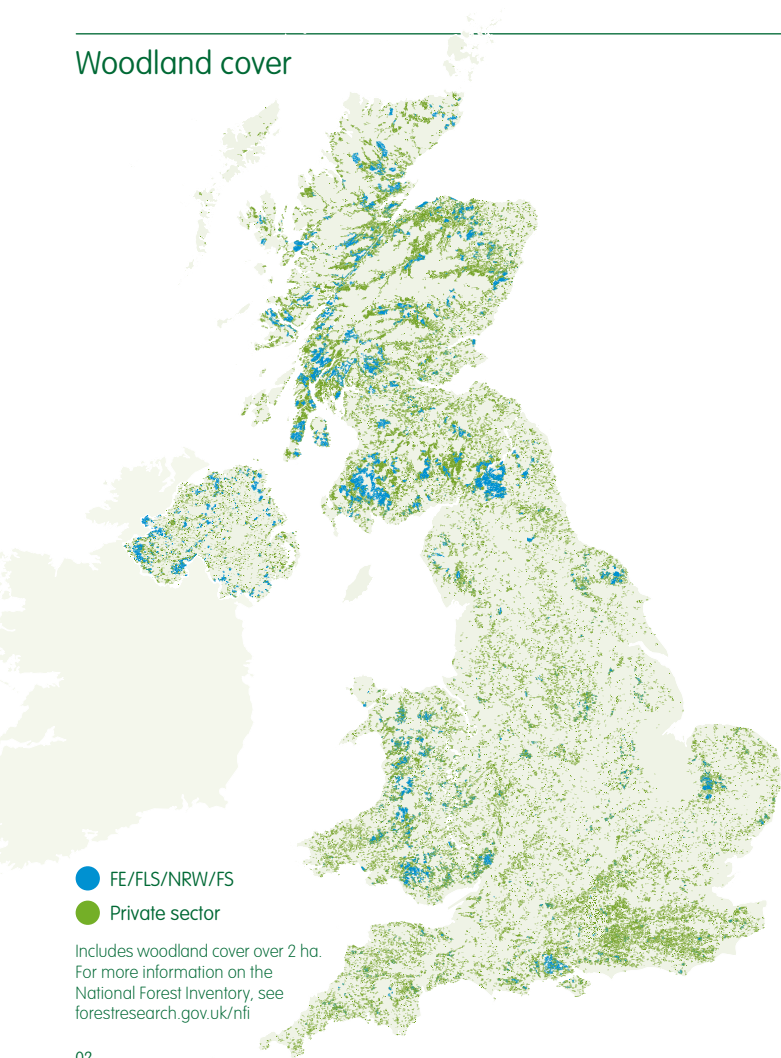

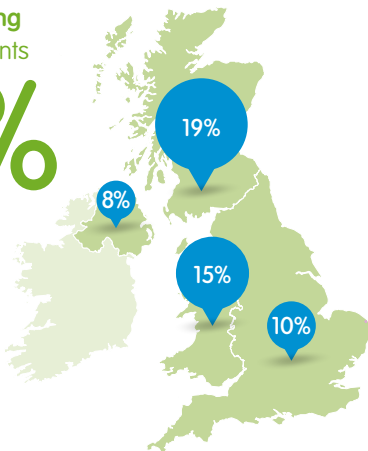

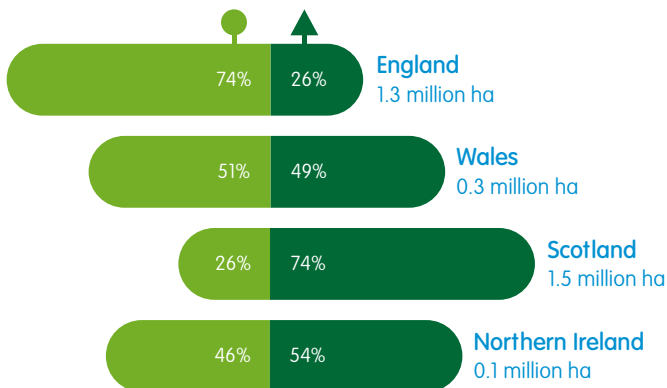

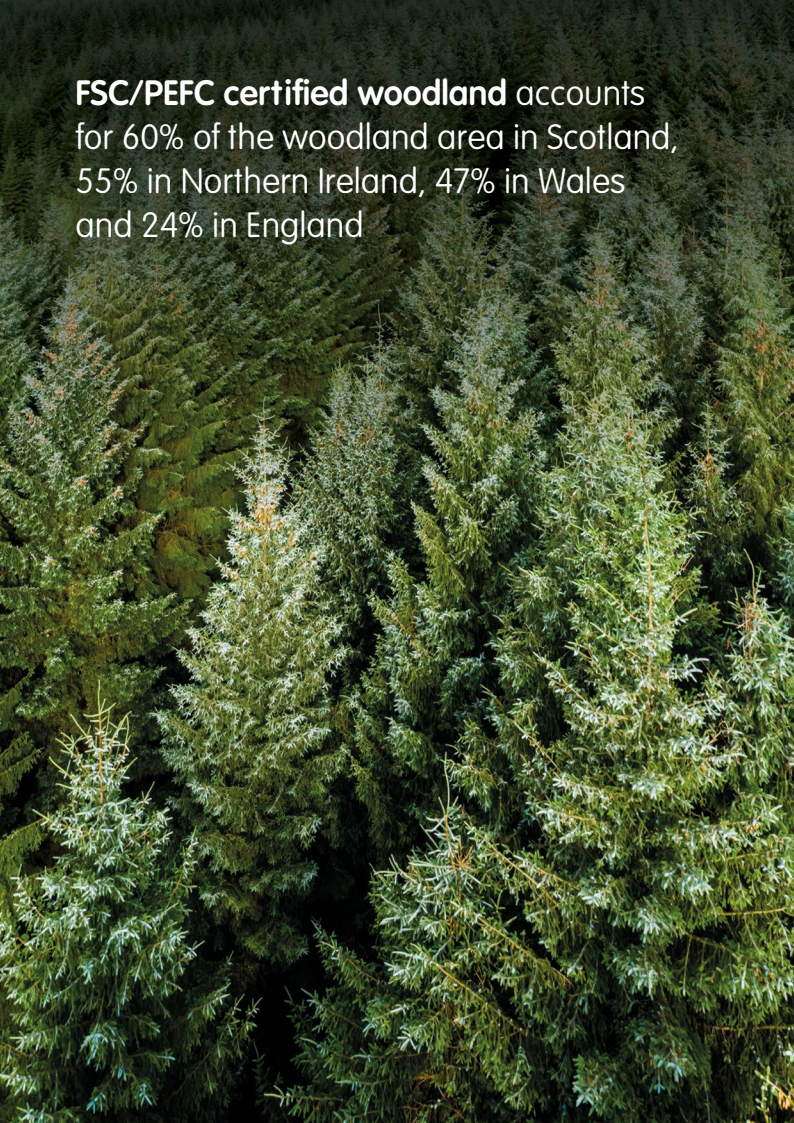

FSC/PEFC certified woodland accounts for 60% of the woodland area in Scotland, 55% in Northern Ireland, 47% in Wales and 24% in England



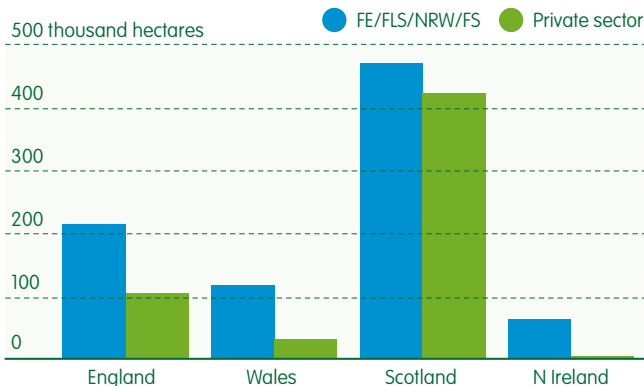

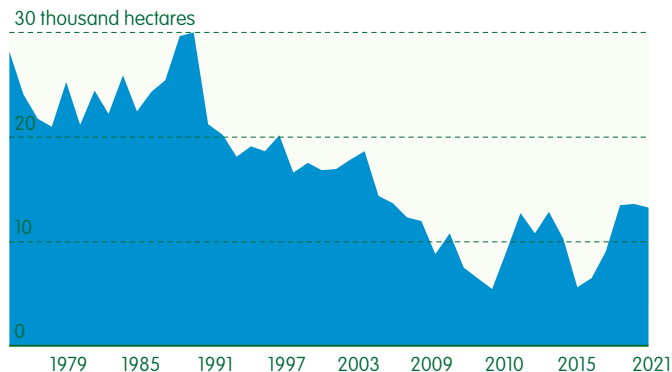

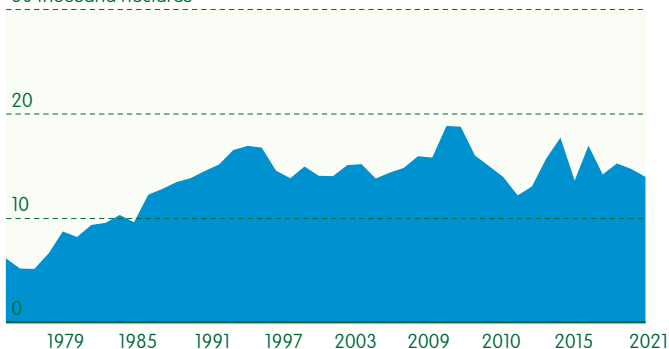

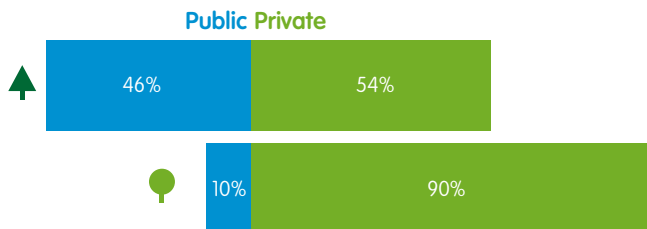

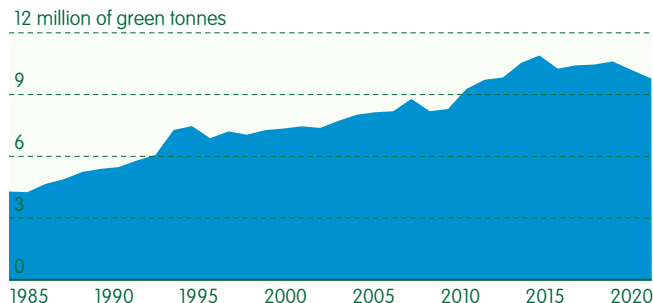

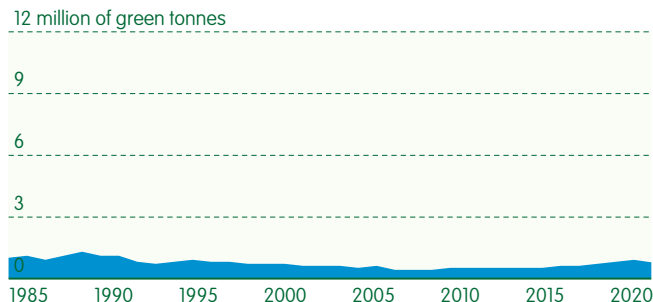

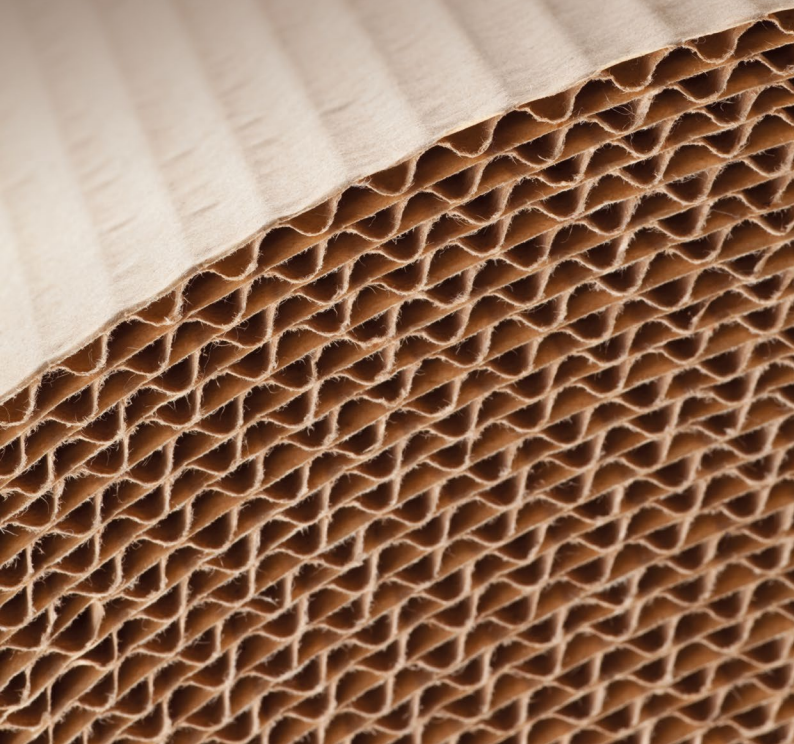

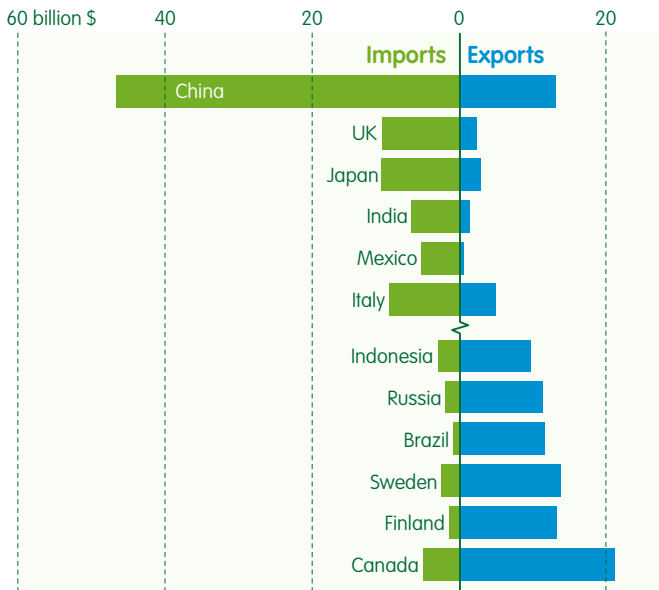

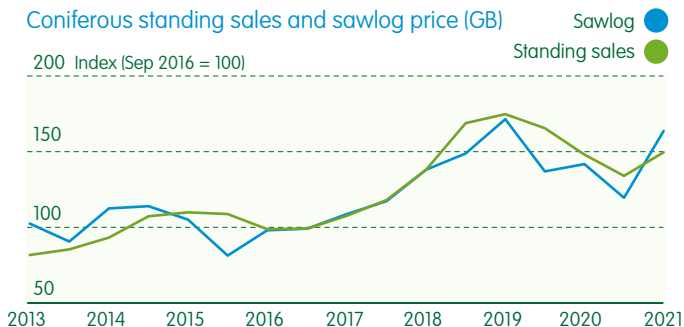

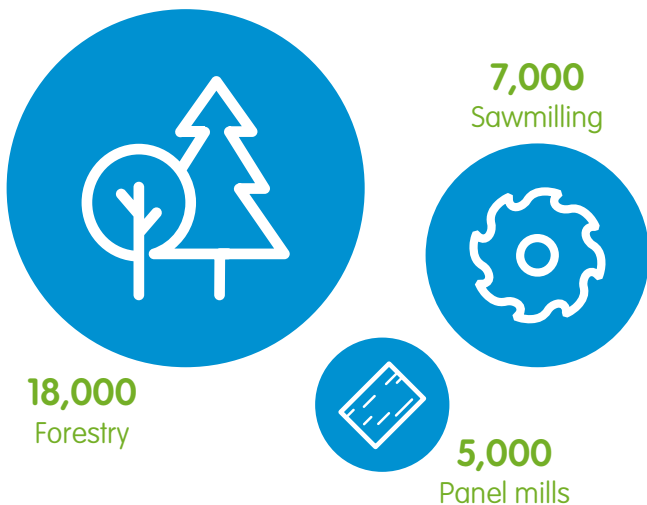

Employment in UK forestry and wood processing

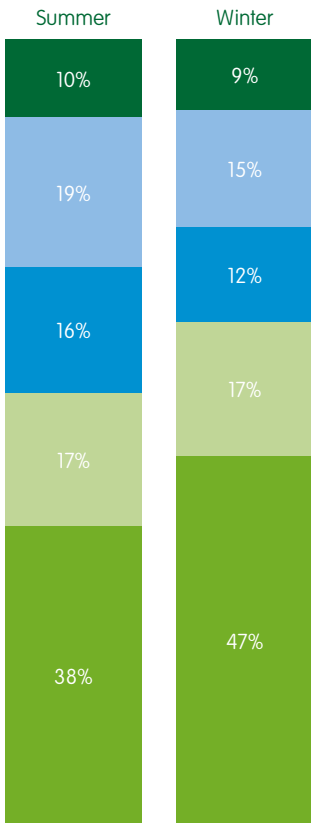

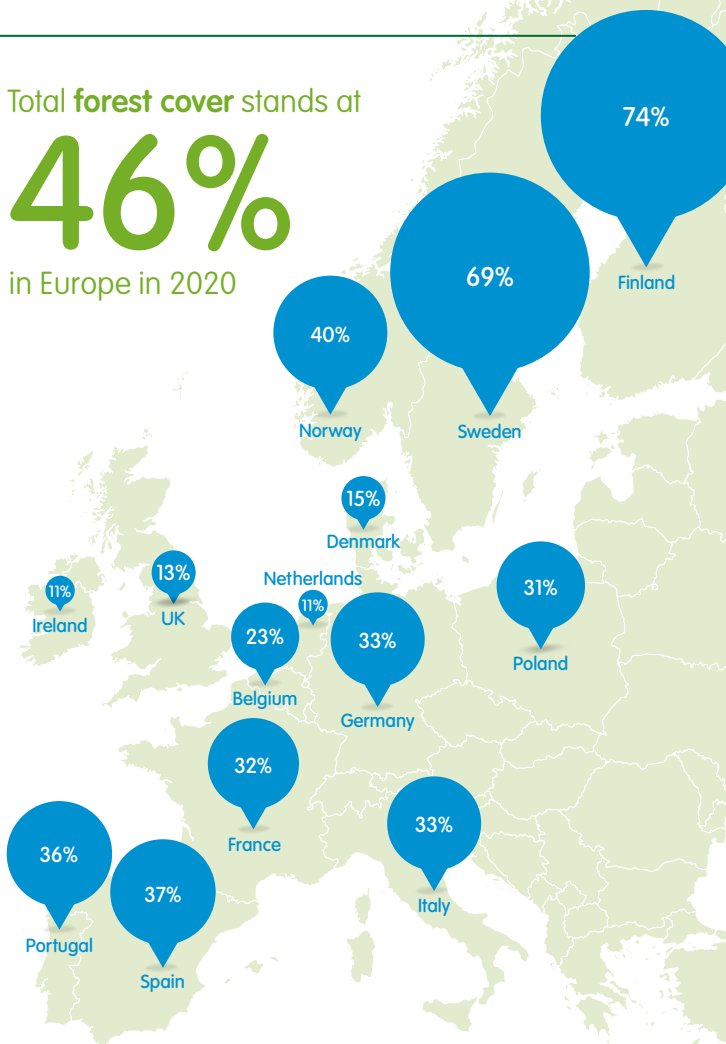

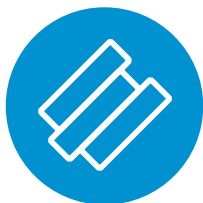



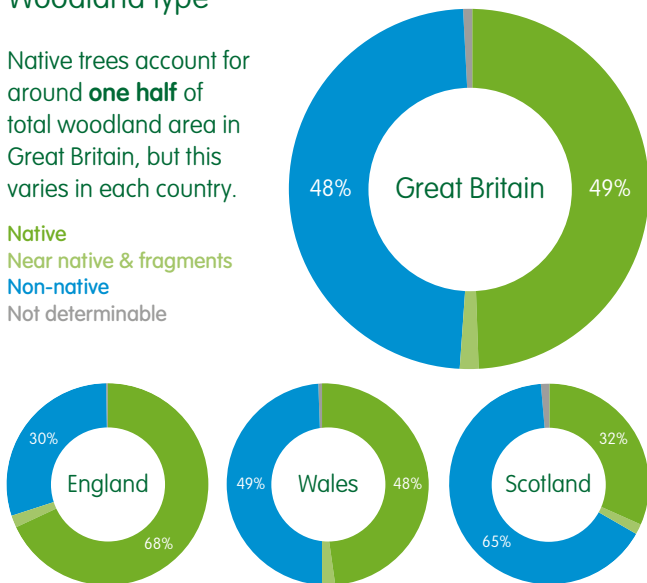

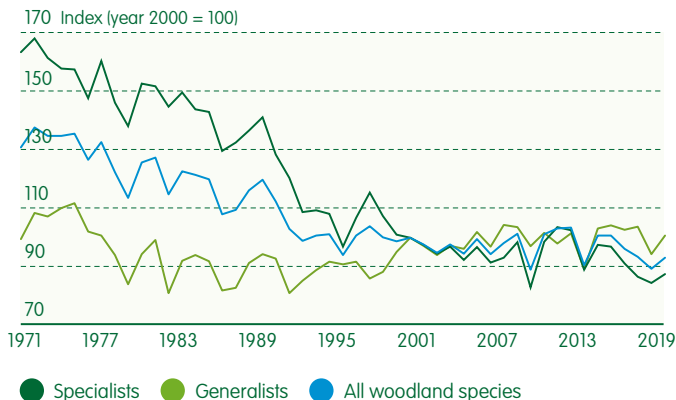

Carbon stock in UK forests is estimated to have increased, from around **3.2 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 1990 to **4 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 2020.
