




Conifers account for around **one half** of the woodland area in the UK overall, but the proportion varies in each country.





Largest net importers and exporters of forests products in 2020





Gross value added in forestry and primary wood processing (£ million)







Frequency of visitors to UK woodland











The carbon stored in UK forest **soils** accounts for over two-thirds of forest carbon stock.

Carbon stock in UK forests is estimated to have increased, from around **3.2 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 1990 to **4.0 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 2020.
