


Broadleaves account for just over **one half** of the woodland area in the UK, but the proportion varies in each country.









Largest net importers and exporters of forest products in 2021



Gross value added in forestry and primary wood processing (£ million) in 2021

















The woodland bird population has **fallen by 34%** since 1970





Carbon stock in UK forests is estimated to have increased from around **3.2 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 1990 to **4.0 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 2020.
