A summary of statistics about woodland and forestry in the UK

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

- One green tonne is equivalent to approximately 0.98 m<sup>3</sup> underbark softwood or 0.88 m<sup>3</sup> underbark hardwood, and to approximately 1.22 m<sup>3</sup> overbark standing softwood or 1.11 m<sup>3</sup> overbark standing hardwood.








Broadleaves account for just over **one half** of the woodland area in the UK, but the proportion varies in each country.











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

#### Largest net importers and exporters of forest products in 2021













### Carbon



Carbon stock in UK forests is estimated to have increased from around **3.2 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 1990 to **4.0 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 2020.

Projected carbon sequestration from registered Woodland Carbon Code projects\* increased by 23% between 2022 and 2023
