







Broadleaves account for just over **one-half** of the woodland area in the UK, but the proportion varies in each country.



1.44 million hectares of woodland in the UK are **FSC/PEFC certified**











Largest net importers and exporters of forest products in 2023









In 2023, 84% of the UK public agreed that 'a lot more trees should be planted' in response to the threat of **climate change**





Carbon



Carbon stock in UK forests is estimated to have increased from around **3.2 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 1990 to **4.1 billion tonnes** of carbon dioxide equivalent in 2025.
